We are looking for student employees to work primarily during the times listed on the grid below. If you are only available for Summer 1 (May 13-June 7) or Summer 2 (June 10-Aug 9), please be very clear in indicating when you are available to work which hours. You may want to fill out 2 separate schedules if your availability is different for each summer session.

We also have an **availability** section. This section is used for shifts that may arise during the semester. If you are available during the times needed you will get first priority for the shift. Please list availability Monday-Friday, 8:00-5:45 basis. The times do not have to be the same each weekday nor do you have to be available each weekday, you do however have to be available the same hours each week throughout the summer. Please also list the total number of hours you would like to work each day.

Sometimes, your availability does not match the shifts we need filled. We may offer you a position as an 'on-call substitute'. These are not guaranteed hours. Each week we send out an email to all student employees, listing shifts that need to be filled for the following week. You would have the opportunity to pick up shifts on a weekly basis – maximum of 28 work hours per week and limited by the demands of your classes. Please do not indicate you are available as on-call if you do not intend to pick up at least one shift a week.

If you are enrolled in a UIUC course at any point in the summer you can only work a maximum of 28 hours per week, regardless of your availability during either summer session. If you are not taking classes this summer then you are able to work full-time.

Those blocks with 'NO' noted in them indicate that the shift listed at the left is not available that day.
